Role title: Early Years and Outreach Worker Hours of work: 26 hours per week over 4 days

Salary: £24,778pa (pro rata £17,179pa)

Role Purpose: To deliver services in the community which promote child development, and to undertake mandatory visits and development checks in the Hall Green District

Main functions:

- 1. To undertake 1 year and 2-year old development checks for the Hall Green District.
- 2. To carry out home visits where families have not engaged to conduct their 2-year-old development checks.
- 3. To carry out Attend Anywhere Clinics (virtual video consultations)
- 4. Liaising with Health Visitors and other health professionals to update them on children's development.
- 5. Ensuring lateral checks are completed before clinics and communicating with health.
- 6. Record keeping on Rio/assessment form.
- 7. Making referrals to external/internal agencies and professionals, putting strategies and interventions in place
- 8. Complete recalls and putting interventions in place if required
- 9. Completing exception reports for missed KPI's
- 10. Assisting new practitioners with ASQ's competencies
- 11. To support the changing nature of the mandated child development Reviews
- 12. Provide 'Stay and Play' sessions for target families that promote child development
- 13. Promote reading with babies and toddlers, and provide Book Start in stay and play sessions
- 14. To collect and help collate evidence that demonstrates outcomes for children.
- 15. To provide and promote positive play within the Early Years Foundation Stages for children and support parents/carers in how they play with their children to encourage good child development, including providing sessions in family homes.
- 16. To provide crèche for under 5s while their parents/carers participate in parent-focussed activities.
- 17. To conduct EEE visits, encouraging parents to take up the entitlement and supporting families to find provision.
- 18. Ensure the suitability, safety and cleanliness of toys and other equipment, replenishing the supply of toys as required, within the constraints of the budget.
- 19. To support parents who have under 5s with SEND needs ensuring inclusive practice and signposting to additional specialist support as required.
- 20. Make effective links to family support ensuring all relevant information is shared, as appropriate, in relation to the children and parents.
- 21. Supporting families with Breastfeeding
- 22. To assist with organising and running community events in Hall Green District as appropriate
- 23. To participate in the Trust's performance management scheme
- 24. To participate in the supervision process including the probationary Review

- 25. To undertake personal professional development and training as appropriate
- 26. To undertake any other duties commensurate with the role and responsibilities of the post as agreed with your line manager
- 27. To be familiar with and uphold the Policies and Procedures of the Trust especially those of relating to Safeguarding, Health and Safety, Data Protection and Equalities.
